We wanted to attract more people to try badminton. We opened a court especially for local residents to come and play – for free – and coaching was on offer from Badminton England. The court was busy all weekend, players included a local Police Community Support Officer!

Sunday afternoon, Courts 2 & 3 still going and have now officially broken the Guinness World Record! Massive thanks to Eagle Controls for the donation of the timer. It was one of the highlights of the event.



Over 100 people from the community came out in force to cheer on and witness history as the longest match of doubles badminton now stands at 29 hours. Courts 2 & 3 finished at the same time, only one court can have the record...



The Lord Mayor of Sheffield was among the first to offer his congratulations!



The unsung heroes of the event were the volunteers, including St John Ambulance, who without them could have meant an early finish for Court 2!



The players motivation for taking part was about competing for a record, when the event finished that was the last of our thoughts, we soon began to realise what we'd been a part of, and what the event had done for charity and the local community. Another shout for our volunteers, Naomi, Ed, Amita and Roy committed over 120 hours between them(!) to ensure the smooth running of the event and the paperwork was well managed. How inspiring, especially as they weren't playing!
